

Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

I want to welcome all of those individuals from the Saint Catherine's community who are joining us this weekend. We are glad you are here with us, and are eager to befriend you, and receive the gifts you will share with STM.

As a reminder, I am asking all of us to wear a name tag (available in the Narthex) for our weekend Masses throughout the month of May, as a gesture of charity toward our neighbor.

Learn About the MOScholars K-12 Scholarship Program

In 2021, the Missouri General Assembly established the MOScholars program, a program that provides scholarships of up to \$6,375 per student for children to attend Catholic and other private schools. 
