Larry LeFebvre named State Knight of the Month

St. Thomas More Council's own Larry LeFebvre has been chosen Missouri Knight of the Month for August/September 2009, in recognition of his commitment to the principles of charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism.

Larry serves Council 14270 as Family Director, creating and organizing events like Family Fun Knight, Toast & Roast with Father Don, and the Columbus Knight Dinner. In addition, he coordinates Knights Out dinners and Fifth Sunday breakfasts.

At St. Thomas More, Larry is a lector, homebound minister, lay presider, wake minister and extraordinary minister of the Eucharist.

In the community, Larry is president of his neighborhood association, organized a national memorial service, served on the Boy Scout Community Relations Board, and is a speaker and presenter at Eagle Scout Courts of Honor.

He directs a national youth essay program with over 300,000 participants annually and organizes a trip to the nation's capital each year for the top 54 winners.

Larry served the VFW for 31 years, retiring as Assistant Adjutant General in 2006.

Larry and his wife Mary have been married for 32 years. They have raised three daughters in addition to caring for over 120 children as foster parents over the past twenty years.

Over \$3,700 was raised from Family Fun Knight, Toast & Roast with Father Don, and the Columbus Day Spaghetti Dinner. The MR Drive collected over \$1,600, half of which is returned to the council to distribute locally.

Essay Contest



Through the Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP), Council 14270 has given \$500 each to seminarians Louis Farley and Tim Nguyen. By completing the program, \$100 will be returned to the council for each \$500 donated. Details are at KofC.org

Vocations Chairman Phil Muellner reports that last year, financial help from councils to future priests, sisters and brothers exceeded \$2.6 million. A total of 4,513 seminarians and postulants received support. Since 1981 the Order has provided more than \$38 million in aid through RSVP, helping 61,196 men and women follow their vocations.


