A big thanks to Brother Knights who put on the classic vests to participate in the annual MR Drive, which

raises funds to support the mentally handicapped.

Our annual drive consisted of a "boot block" at Red Bridge and Holmes on Friday, October 9, and our presence at all Masses on October 10 and 11.

Coordinated by Grand Knight Jack Ryan, the boot block, raised \$390.50 in the morning and \$381.11 in the evening, for a total of \$771.61.

Our appeal at weekend Masses raised an additional \$859.13, for a grand total of \$1,630.74.

Half of the money raised by our council is sent to

the state MR fund in support of Cardinal Glennon Children's Medical Center, and half goes to a charity benefitting those with developmental handicaps chosen by STM Council.

Last year, STM Council funds were sent to F.I.R.E. and SPRED.


A hostess was also on hand to direct diners to a table, where they were served a delicious meal of pasta with a choice of three
