Grand Knight's Report

First of all, I want to thank all of you who completed the 2010 Fraternal Activity Survey. This year's numbers compared favorably with 2009, easily qualifying our council for the activity requirement of the Double Star Award. In case anyone asks you what the Knights do for the community, here are this year's reported council totals:

1. Number of visits to:
 - a) the sick — 129
 - b) the bereaved — 67
2. Number of times donated blood — 16
3. Hours of community volunteer service:
 - Church Activities — 811
 - Community Activities — 1429
 - Youth Activities — 855
 - Habitat for Humanity — 0
 - Miscellaneous Activities (not listed above) — 375
4. Hours of fraternal service to sick/disabled members and their families — 185

Speaking of the Star/Double Star Award, we still have a long way to go to reach our new member requirement for the award, but this month we have a golden opportunity to draw in some more men of our parish. Through the initiative of the State Council, each of the bishops in Missouri has written a letter personally inviting men of his diocese to join the Knights of Columbus.




