As we move into March and begin Lent, can spring be far behind? (We all hope not, although this stubborn winter weather can make us start to wonder if spring will ever arrive!) Like most Catholics, Lent is not a season I actually look forward to each year, although, as I like to tell non-Catholic friends, it's hard to really appreciate the mountaintop (Easter) if you haven't been through the valley (Lent).

Our Church and our Order also provide us with four great celebrations in March. The first, of course, is the feast of St. Patrick on the 17th, when we Irish rejoice in the great missionary bishop having driven the "snakes" (Satan's band) out of the formerly pagan Ireland. The second is the feast of St. Joseph on the 19th, of similar importance to several other cultures and also to Knights, who try to model their fatherhood and family life on his great example. On March 25th, nine months before Christmas, the church commemorates the Annunciation, which is fittingly held up as a sign of life's beginning at conception, and the importance of protecting life before birth, a cause where we Knights lead the way. Let's all celebrate these feasts so dear to the hearts of Knights by resolving to bring one new member into our order during the month of March!

Lent, of course, leads up to the great Easter Triduum, and the celebration of our rising to new life in Christ. Coming at the start of spring, Easter has come to be associated with new life in general, which is why the Knights of Columbus have chosen April as the perfect month to hold our Savers of Life collection. (April also puts it 6 months away from the MR Drive.) Similar to the MR Drive, we'll be collecting money after Masses on April 10 & 11 for the Knights' pro-life activities, which include purchasing ultrasound machines and supporting the Vitae Society. (Don't worry, we won't be doing a boot block!) Instead of Tootsie Rolls, we'll be handing out Savers of Life seed packets, with real sunflower seeds. MR Program Update

State MR Promotions Director Ed Columbus

With 27 councils left to report, the MR totals stand at 90% of our goal with \$572,806.16. Please try to get your final reports to me by the end of March. My Chairmen and I will be calling councils that have not returned their final report or still have outstanding turnaround money avail-



able. Thank you to all of the councils that met the deadline for submitting form #4584, Partnership Profile Report with Special Olympics, with Supreme.

At this printing 39 councils have returned the form, reporting donations of \$39,084, including 317 volunteers totalling 2628 hours. Last year we received an additional \$3750 from Supreme for Special Olympics in Missouri. There is still time for your council to donate to the Contest of Concern for Special Olympics and be recognized at the State Convention in April. To date 48 councils, auxiliaries, and assemblies have donated a total of \$22,755.49 to the Contest of Concern for Special Olympics. We are at 65% of our goal of \$35,000.

The raffle of an HD TV, laptop computer and a GPS system for Contest of Concern is going well. Sales are brisk with a total turned in so far of \$2669. Tickets will be sold all the way until the drawing at the state convention. If you are not able to get the money and stubs to me before the convention, send them or bring them with you when you come; they will get in the drawing.

It has been a privilege and a pleasure working with all of you these past two years as your director. I have met more people than I can count and as many friends. Thanks to all who have made the MR Program a success. Thanks for the memories.
